Their family emigrated to the US to be able to give their kids a better life. Isabel is a passionate and driven leader who continues to maintain a 4.0 while balancing extracurriculars and work. In addition they are a member of the Student Advisory Council. Which most recently involved taking pictures at the High School's Ground Breaking Ceremony and being a representative for student needs. When they're not at school or performing, Isabel plays on the school soccer and volleyball teams, and also works weekends at Burger King.

Their leadership and work ethic in Middle School was recognised by Principal Andy Steketee and was one of three students personally invited by him to be part of the Middle School Mentoring Steering Committee.

# SUPPORT LOCAL STUDENTS

## \$5,000

Provides 1 year worth of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion training for our staff, mentors, and partners to learn how DEI principles and tools can help improve mentoring relationships and support students and families.

# \$2,500

Ensures six families are provided with holistic support and resource navigation of mentoring and beyond by highly competent, empathic, bilingual staff members for one year.

## \$1,200

Provides 60 hours of direct mentoring supervision during virtual, hybrid or in-person mentoring by our highly trained and experienced staff.

#### \$500

Offers 20 hours of equity based barrier reduction for Site Coordinators to provide training, make referrals, and ensure that matches have everything they need for a healthy relationship.

#### \$250

Provides health and safety supplies for students and mentors in our Mentor Centers.

#### \$100

\$100 takes one student off the waiting list: provides a background check, interview, screening, 3 hour pre-match training for one mentor.

#### \$50

\$50 provides mentoring match supplies for 5 matches/year. Books, pencils, games, arts and craft supplies, notebooks/paper, activities, flash cards, office supplies, etc.




